A Regular Meeting of the Highland Park Mayor and Council was held in Borough Hall, 221 South 5th Avenue, on Tuesday, April 17, 2012 and was called to order by Mayor Minkoff at 7:00 PM. Mayor Minkoff read the Open Public Meetings Statement.

Present: Mayor Minkoff; Councilpersons Erickson, Millet, Welkovits; Borough AttorneySchmierer;

Borough Administrator Kovach; Borough Clerk Hullings.

Absent: Councilpersons Brill Mittler, Foster-Dublin, Morris.

Main Street Minute was presented by Paul Lanaris. He thanked resident and Freeholder Jim Polos. His company sent a huge crew over to paint their new space. He sits on the Board and was a huge help. Main Street and Highland Park is very fortunate to have such wonderful volunteers.

Mayor Minkoff asked the Council members to present their reports.

<u>Councilwoman Welkovits</u> noted that the Earth Day/Health Fair will be held at the Highland Park High School on April 22nd from 1-4PM.

Councilman Millet thanked Paul Lanaris and Main Street Highland Park for their work. Still in negotiations for Mt. Laurel litigation. Motions were put off until May 11th.

<u>Councilman Erickson</u> noted that the Earth Day/Health Fair event is important as they are launching the "It's in our Power" Campaign. Residents can sign up for energy audits.

Borough Administrator - No Report.

Borough Attorney Schmierer noted that they will appear on May 11th before Judge Paley.

Mayor Minkoff reported that a real estate agent visited Main Street Highland Park that specializes in bringing businesses (i.e. small regional chains). He also met with Andrea Baay about the Mayor's Teen Advisory Council. She will discuss this matter with Department Heads and the Recreation Advisory Committee to launch in the fall of the upcoming school year. This group will have a liaison from the Governing Body. Lastly, he reported that he shared lunch with approximately 100 seniors. He was thrilled to meet with them and they had many questions. He was grateful for the opportunity to spend time with them and will meet with them again on a recurring basis.

Mayor Minkoff opened the meeting for public discussion for a fifteen minute period and called upon all those wishing to speak to identify themselves.

Ruth Bickhardt, 307 Magnolia Street, commented that she is a strong advocate for sidewalk safety. She is now visually impaired. She is pleading that the Council educate residents about bike safety. Mayor Minkoff noted that this topic came up at the senior luncheon. He noted that there is a newly constituted bicycle/pedestrian task force. Councilwoman Welkovits noted that they started a new group consisting of 2 representatives from the Board of Health, Chief Rizco and Sgt. Hammill. They talked about safety and education, bells/lights on bicycles and requirements for riding on streets and sidewalks. They talked extensively about education and will get information put on the website. They are preparing pamphlets and having them transcribed into other languages. She asked that Ms. Bickhardt join them so that she can provide input. Ms. Bickhardt noted that she has posters available in English, Spanish and Chinese. Chief Rizco noted that they are reviewing ordinances from other towns. State law mandates light and audible devices. No State law about riding on the sidewalk. It would have to be done by municipal ordinance. Ms. Bickhardt suggested that they make 1 side of the Albany Street bridge for pedestrians and one 1 side for bicycle riders. She also asked that they compel people to trim their hedges back because sidewalks are narrow.

Allan Williams, 319 Harrison Avenue, noted that they will be showing 2 environmental films at Borough Hall on April 22nd at 7PM.

No one else appearing to be heard, the Mayor closed the public discussion.

The Clerk reported advertising an ordinance entitled, BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER 1810 HERETOFORE FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH ON MAY 3, 2011 ENTITLED, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING, BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (THE "BAPPROPRIATING \$4,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,809,523 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF," TO INCREASE THE APPROPRIATION THEREIN BY \$2,900,000 AND TO INCREASE THE AUTHORIZATION OF BONDS OR NOTES THEREIN BY \$2,761,904 TO FINANCE PART OF THE ADDITIONAL COSTS THEREOF, for consideration of passage on final reading by title and that affidavits of publication thereto are on file. Mayor Minkoff declared the public hearing on the ordinance open to all officials and persons present and called upon all those wishing to speak for or against the ordinance to do so.

No one appearing to be heard and no objections having been received in writing, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Matter to be voted on again at 5/1/12 meeting due to the fact that there are not enough Council Members present to vote on adoption of the ordinance.
