The Agency's proposed 2018 Budget of \$196,394 is a substantial increase over last year's budget of \$50,000. The balance of the Agency's budget--\$50,000—is identical to its 2017 budget. Therefore, the only change in revenue is the inclusion of the grant money in the Agency's budget. The grant money will be applied solely to the project for which it was obtained.
