AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, CHAPTER 328, "SEWER AND WATER"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 328-23 of the "Code of the Borough of Highland Park" shall have the water consumption rates increased as shown below and the relevant portions of the ordinance shall read as follows:

- § Section 328-23 Water consumption rates.
- A. Rates. The rate charged for all water used by each consumer shall be as follows:

Usage Amount	Rate
0 to 799 cubic feet	\$40.88 flat charge
800 to 999 cubic feet	\$53.00 flat charge
1,000 to 3,499	\$66.21 per 1,000 cubic feet
3,500 and up	\$70.84 per 1,000 cubic feet

SECTION 2. Section 328-38 of the "Code of the Borough of Highland Park" shall have the sewer rental rates increased as shown below and the relevant portions of the ordinance shall read as follows:

- § 328-38 Sanitary sewer rentals.
- A. Rates. Sewer rental shall be paid quarterly for the use of the sanitary sewers connected to any premises or lot in the Borough of Highland Park, in accordance with the following rates and classifications:
- (4) Rates. The rates charged for all sewer rentals for each consumer shall be as follows:

Usage Amount	Rate
0 to 799 cubic feet	\$32.55 flat charge
800 to 999 cubic feet	\$41.83 flat charge
1,000 to 3,499	\$50.61 per 1,000 cubic feet
3,500 and up	\$54.15 per 1,000 cubic feet

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 17th day of December 2019, by and between the BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices located at 221 South 5th Avenue, Highland Park, New Jersey 08904 (hereinafter referred to as "BOROUGH") and CME Associates, 3141 Bordentown Avenue, Parlin, New Jersey 08859 (hereinafter referred to as "COMPANY").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the **BOROUGH** requires professional services in connection with the Implementation of the 2020 Roadway Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the **BOROUGH** has adopted a Resolution authorizing the award of a Contract for said professional services to the **COMPANY** without competitive bidding as permitted by *N.J.S.A.* 40A:11-1, *et seq*.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED between the **BOROUGH** and the **COMPANY**, as follows:

- 1. Effective December 17th, 2019, the **COMPANY** shall render professional services for the **BOROUGH** as required by the **BOROUGH**.
- 2. The **BOROUGH** agrees to compensate the **COMPANY** as set forth on the proposal dated December 11, 2019 a copy of which is attached hereto is *Schedule A* and made a part hereof; the amount of said compensation shall not exceed **\$95,116.00** unless amended by further action of the **BOROUGH** for the above mentioned services.
- 3. The **BOROUGH** agrees to pay the **COMPANY** for any actual disbursements and out of pocket expenses incurred in carrying out its duties, as set forth in *Schedule A*.

- 4. The COMPANY shall submit monthly billing to the BOROUGH for said services, if any, on vouchers as required by the BOROUGH. The BOROUGH agrees to process and pay said vouchers in the same manner as other municipal vouchers. The BOROUGH requires billing for professional services to be done to the nearest 1/4 hour.
- 5. The parties hereto hereby incorporate by reference herein the Affirmative Action Addendum attached hereto and made a part hereof as *Exhibit B*.
- 6. The **COMPANY** agrees to file its New Jersey Business Registration Certificate with the **BOROUGH**'s Chief Financial Officer.
- 7. The **COMPANY** agrees to adhere to and comply with the provisions of the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play Act, *N.J.S.A.* 19:44A-20.1, and the **BOROUGH**'s Pay-to-Play Ordinance No. 1705, as per attached *Exhibit C.*

As you are aware, the NJDOT has awarded the Borough with a 2020 NJDOT Municipal Aid Grant of \$475,000.00 for the above referenced project. The application submitted to the NJDOT was for the improvements to portions of Volker Street, Benner Street, South 6th Avenue, Braun Avenue, South 9th Avenue, North 4th Avenue, North 9th Avenue, Lexington Avenue, Barnard Street and South 10th Avenue. Our preliminary construction cost estimate for same was \$818,573 not including the construction administration funding request.

The cost estimate included \$80,000 for Uniformed Police Traffic Directors which is a state non participating item and would not be eligible under the grant. As part of the project design, recommend the Borough hire a contractor to perform a video inspection of the sewer lines within the project limits so we can review the information and advise you if any repairs are needed. If there are, they would increase the cost of the project as they are a state non participating item and would not be eligible under the grant.

It is our understanding the Borough would like to use the NJDOT grant money to fund the improvements to South 6th Avenue between Magnolia Street and Benner Street, South 9th Avenue between Eden Avenue and Graham Street, North 9th Avenue between Raritan Avenue and Abbott Street, Benner Street between South 7th Avenue and South 9th Avenue, North 4th Avenue between Madison Avenue and Montgomery Street and Barnard Street between Central Avenue and Woodbridge Avenue. We anticipate the state participating portions of these road improvements would be similar to the grant amount. The work would include upgrading or installing handicap ramps at corners, replacing damaged curbing, replacing aprons as required to make curb repairs, storm sewer inlet repairs and upgrades and the milling and resurfacing of the asphalt roadways.

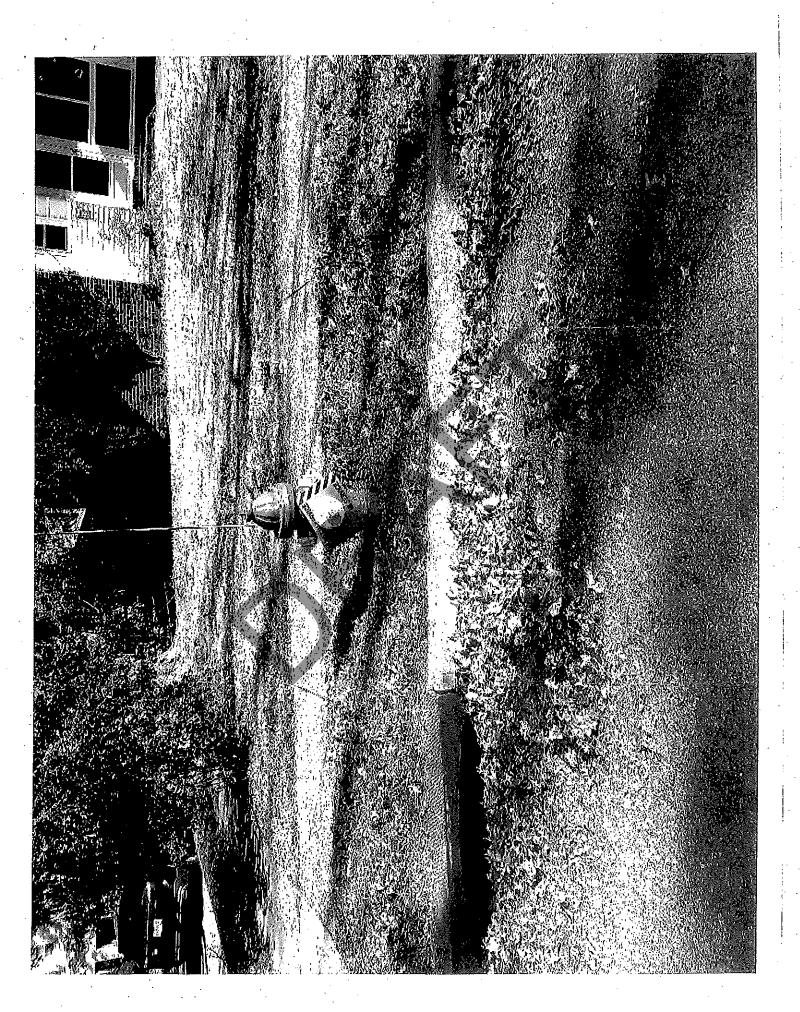
