BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK ORDINANCE NO. 19-

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 114 OF THE "CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, 2010" TO ENACT A NEW ARTICLE IV TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF DOGS OR CATS FROM "PUPPY MILLS"

WHEREAS, a significant number of puppies and kittens sold at pet shops come from large-scale, commercial breeding facilities where the health and welfare of the animals are not adequately provided for ("puppy mills" and "kitten mills," respectively). According to The Humane Society of the United States, it is estimated that 10,000 puppy mills produce more than 2,400,000 puppies a year in the United States and that most pet shop dogs and cats come from puppy mills and kitten mills.

WHEREAS, the documented abuses endemic to puppy and kitten mills include overbreeding; inbreeding; minimal to non-existent veterinary care; lack of adequate and nutritious food, water and shelter; lack of socialization; lack of adequate space; and lack of adequate exercise.

WHEREAS, the inhumane conditions in puppy and kitten mill facilities lead to health and behavioral issues in the animals bred in those facilities, which many consumers are unaware of when purchasing animals from pet shops. These health and behavioral issues, which may not present themselves until sometime after the purchase of the animals, can impose financial and emotional costs on consumers.

WHEREAS, restricting the retail sale of puppies and kittens to only those that are sourced from shelters or rescue organizations is likely to decrease the demand for puppies and kittens bred in puppy and kitten mills, and is likely to increase demand for animals from animal shelters and rescue organizations.

WHEREAS, according to the New Jersey Department of Health Animal Intake and Disposition Survey, thousands of dogs and cats are euthanized in New Jersey animal shelters annually. Restricting the retail sale of puppies and kittens to only those that are sourced from animal shelters and rescue organizations will likely reduce pet overpopulation and thus the burden on such agencies and financial costs on local taxpayers.

WHEREAS, this Ordinance will not affect a consumer's ability to obtain a dog or cat of his or her choice directly from a breed-specific rescue organization or shelter, or from a hobby breeder where the consumer can see directly the conditions in which the dogs and cats are bred or can confer directly with the hobby breeder concerning those conditions; and

WHEREAS, this governing body believes it is in the best interests of the Borough to adopt reasonable regulations to reduce costs to Borough and its residents, protect the citizens of the Borough who may purchase cats or dogs from a pet shop or other business establishment, help prevent inhumane breeding conditions, promote community awareness of animal welfare and foster a more humane environment in the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED by the Highland Park Borough Council, Middlesex County as follows:

Chapter 114 of "Code of the Borough of Highland Park, 2010", Chapter 14 is amended by adding thereto the following new Article IV, which shall read as follows:

Article IV. Restriction on Sale of Cats and Dogs by Pet Shops.

1. Section 114-38. <u>Definitions</u>:

As used in this Article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

ANIMAL CARE FACILITY means an animal control center or animal shelter, maintained by or under contract with any state, county or municipality, whose mission and practice is, in whole, or significant part, the rescue and placement of animals in permanent homes.

ANIMAL RESCUE ORGANIZATION means any not-for-profit organization which has tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, whose mission and practice is, in whole or in significant part, the rescue and placement of animals in permanent homes.

CAT means a member of a species of domestic cat, Felis catus. DOG means a member of a species of domestic dog, Canis familiaris.

OFFER FOR SALE means to sell offer for sale or adoption, advertise for the sale of, barter, auction, give away or otherwise dispose of a dog or cat.

PET SHOP means a retail establishment where dogs and cats are sold, exchanged, bartered or offered for sale as pet animals to the general public at retail. Such definition shall not include an animal care facility or animal rescue organization, as defined.

2. Section 114-39. <u>Restrictions on the Sale of Animals</u>. No pet store shall sell, deliver or offer for sale, barter, auction, give away or otherwise transfer or dispose of cats or dogs. Nothing in this section shall prohibit pet shops from collaborating with animal care facilities or animal rescue organizations to offer space for such entities to showcase adoptable dogs and cats.

3. Section 114-40. <u>Record Keeping and Disclosure</u>. A pet shop shall maintain records, stating the name and the address of the animal care facility or animal rescue organization that each cat or dog was obtained from for at least two years following the date of acquisition. Such records shall be made available, immediately upon request, to the Borough of Highland Park Police Department and submitted annually, and no later than May of each calendar year, to the Clerk of the Borough of Highland Park. Each pet shop shall display on each cage a label stating the name and address of the animal facility or animal rescue organization of each animal kept in the cage.

4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not effect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided for by law.

BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK ORDINANCE NO. 19-

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, <u>CHAPTER 16, "CLAIMS APPROVAL</u>"

Council as a Whole:

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park establishes policies and procedures for purchasing; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park has set a cost threshold whereby items with an estimated cost or price of \$1,000 or more must get a multiple quotes; and

WHEREAS, *N.J.S.A 40A:11-6.1* requires quotations for items that cost more than 15 percent of the established municipal bid threshold, which range between \$2,625 and \$6,000 in New Jersey, depending on whether or not there is a Qualified Purchasing Agent in place; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Highland Park has not made an increase in the quotation threshold in more than ten years and the cost of items and services has increased; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park has determined that the quotation threshold be increased to \$2,500.

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 16-3 C of the "Code of the Borough of Highland Park" governing "Action by person making purchase" be amended as follows:

C. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A 11-6.1, whenever practicable, on any purchase, contract or agreement, except in the case of the performance of professional services, where the estimated cost or price of which is \$2,500 or more, the department head or duly designated employee shall solicit quotations. The award thereof shall be made on the basis of the lowest responsible quotation received, which quotation is most advantageous to the Borough, price and other factors considered; provided, however, that if the department head or duly designated employee deems it impracticable to solicit competitive quotations in the case of extraordinary, unspecifiable service, or in the case of such service or any other purchase, contract or agreement awarded hereunder, having sought such quotations, determines that it should not be awarded on the basis of the lowest quotation received, the department head or duly designated employee shall file a statement of explanation of the reason or reasons therefor, which shall be placed on file with the purchase, contract or agreement.

2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as provided for by law.

THIS CONTRACT entered into this 1st day of January 2020,

between the COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal office at, 75 Bayard Street, New Brunswick, New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY" and the BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK having its principal office at 221 South Fifth Avenue, in the County of Middlesex and the State of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the "MUNICIPALITY",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has created the Middlesex County Office of Health Services pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 26:3A2-1 *et seq.*, to provide an array of public health services; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality is desirous of contracting with the County for furnishing by the County to the Municipality health services of a technical and professional nature as more fully set forth below; and

WHEREAS, the parties to this contract are authorized to contract for said services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 *et seq*.;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, agreements and other considerations between the parties, the parties do hereby mutually covenant and agree as follows:

All of the above mentioned activities shall be provided in accordance with the <u>Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of</u> <u>Health in New Jersey</u> as set forth at <u>N.J.A.C.</u> Title 8:52-1.1 *et seq.* and the regulations promulgated under the County Environmental Health Act (CEHA) <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 7:1H *et. seq.*

3. In addition to the above public health services, the County will continue to provide specialized grant services.

In the event a particular public health service or activity exceeds the actual cost to provide said services, the Director shall have the discretion to determine whether the service or activity is necessary, shall be modified, may seek alternative funding or may engage in negotiations with the Municipality for the costs in excess of what is provided for in this Agreement.

In the event that the County or the Director seeks to exercise its rights under paragraph 4 hereof, determing services are necessary and seeking costs in excess of what is provided for in this Agreement, the County

and/or Director shall provide written notice to the Municipality sixty (60) days in advance of any increased costs sought, at which time the Borough of Highland Park shall have the option to accept the increased costs, negotiate a mutual acceptable amount, or shall be permitted to explore and find an alternate method of delivery for said services and/or to terminate the agreement within the sixty (60) days thereof.

- The term of this contract shall be for two (2) years commencing on
 January 1, 2020, and terminating on December 31, 2021, unless terminated
 earlier as provided for hereinafter.
- 7. The base cost for the provision of the aforesaid health services shall be as follows:

2020 - \$46,233.68 2021 - \$47.158.35

It is understood that the costs, as set forth above, reflect the actual cost to the County to provide the health services.

8. Should the Municipality utilize the early termination procedures set forth in Paragraph 12, then in that event, the Municipality shall pay to the County any increases in the cost to the County to provide said services in the year of termination. Said payment shall be made by the Municipality within thirty (30) days from the receipt from the County of a statement of such additional costs.

9. The Municipality shall designate during the life of this contract, the Director of the County Office of Health Services as the Health Officer of the of the Municipality, who shall be its general agent for the enforcement of the local

health ordinances and the laws, rules and regulations of the New Jersey Health Department.

10. The Director of the County Office of Health Services shall supervise and direct all public health activities and health employees of the Municipality.

11. Said Director or his representative shall attend the monthly meetings of the local Board of Health and shall report to the Committee on Health of the Board of Chosen Freeholders at least annually. Copies of said report shall be furnished to the Municipality.

12. This contract may be terminated by either of the parties, upon written notice by the party desiring to terminate said contract. Such notice shall be given no later than 120 days prior to January 1st of each contract year.

13. The contract shall be subject to the approval of the State Commissioner of Health.

14. During the period that the County Office of Health Services provides health services as set forth above, any State aid received by the Municipality for such health services shall be paid to the County of Middlesex and deducted from the actual costs of services.

RESOLUTION CONDEMNING ALL FORMS OF ANTI-SEMITISM

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that anti-Semitism today is being promoted by individuals and groups at both ends of the political spectrum; and,

WHEREAS, Jewish citizens and residents of Highland Park are experiencing a significant increase in anti-Semitic incidents, including several incidents of anti-Semitic harassment of individuals on the street, property destruction, and hate speech; and,

WHEREAS, the Highland Park Borough Council is aware of the rise of incidents of bias, hate speech and discriminatory behaviors that have impacted our Highland Park youth in our schools on social media, and that hate speech groups are targeting our school age children with messages of hate and sowing division and anti-Semitism among them; and,

WHEREAS, we commend New Jersey's Acting Governor Sheila Oliver for issuing Executive Order No. 78 on August 7, 2019, which establishes an interagency task force to provide advice and recommendations to the Offices of the Governor and the Attorney General, and to other state agencies, on strategies and actions to reduce incidents of hate, bias, and intolerance involving students and young adults in our schools¹; and,

WHEREAS, we acknowledge that following the attacks on the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh and the Chabad of Poway in San Diego by white supremacists, synagogues in Highland Park were forced to re-evaluate their own security measures to keep their congregations safe; and,

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes that to many, including Highland Park residents of multiple faiths, Israel represents the historical, spiritual and religious homeland of the Jewish people, as expressed in Israel's Declaration of Independence and before that the Balfour Declaration; and,

WHEREAS, attempts in both our nation and our community to demonize, dehumanize and delegitimize Jews, who live in their historical homeland and all over the world, even to the extent of denying historical and archeological evidence is just another form of racism and anti-Semitism; and,

WHEREAS, current efforts to deny the Jewish people their right of self-determination and even their right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, by claiming that the existence of a State of Israel, as a homeland for the Jewish people is racist, despite evidence that while imperfect, Israel provides freedom of religion, culture, and economic aspirations even during periods of intense terrorist activities; and,

WHEREAS, in contrast to legitimate protest movements that have sought racial justice and social change and promoted coexistence, civil rights and political reconciliation, movements that co-opt legitimate means to unfairly promote economic warfare against the State of Israel in an attempt to deny its legitimacy, existence and the right of the Jewish people to national self-determination are anti-Semitic and contrary to the essential values of government under which this council performs its obligations to the public; and,

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WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that there are residents and citizens of Highland Park who may criticize the State of Israel and support economic boycotts against the State of Israel, but are themselves not anti-Semitic²:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Highland Park condemn all forms of anti-Semitism, and pledge to work with the Human Relations Commission and other interested parties to develop significant and sustained programming designed to educate our community about all aspects of anti-Semitism and combat its continued spread.
