Memo from Mayor Brill Mittler



Spring-like weather is finally here, and hopefully the cold and snow is over for the season! Of course, all of the bad weather wreaked havoc on roads throughout New Jersey. Highland Park's Department of Public Works has already begun to repair the potholes winter left throughout town, and will be working diligently to keep the roads safe for drivers and bikers.

The surprisingly cold weather in April may be a result of the larger issue of global climate change. To help combat destructive climate change, I have joined mayors throughout the country to push legislation and policies to benefit our environment and fight climate change. The Climate Mayors organization, and others like this, is working to make sure the next generation does not suffer the consequences of severe climate change. The community of Highland Park has always been in the forefront of environmental and sustainable initiatives as well. Recently our Sustainable Highland Park organization created a Plastic Bag Reduction Campaign to educate and encourage shoppers to stop using plastic bags, and to use re-usable bags instead. Partnering with our local Stop & Shop, they held a weekly raffle, in which Stop & Shop patrons who used re-usable bags, or refused a plastic bag, could enter into a weekly drawing for a \$25 gift card. Each week, nearly 600 shoppers were eligible for the raffle. This speaks to the deep concern so many of our residents have for sustainability issues.

The Plastic Bag Campaign will be featured at our annual Earth Day Celebration on April 22nd, at the Environmental Center on River Road. This celebration attracts hundreds of residents and visitors every year, with music, food, and educational games and crafts for the entire family. It is always a fun day, and I encourage you to come out to celebrate our Earth with your friends and neighbors.

In even more sustainable news, I am very excited about a project we have been working on with the Department of Environmental Protection, the Board of Public Utilities and PSE&G. PSE&G is planning on installing a solar field in an old landfill in Highland Park adjacent to the Meadows Trail. This solar field will be the first ever to collect power in a series of batteries that will determine the impact of solar energy on the grid. This research will benefit not only Highland Park, but also the rest of New Jersey. Because the solar field is being installed on an old landfill, the environmental process takes some time, but we are looking forward to the installation and future benefits of the solar field!

I look forward to seeing you at upcoming spring events such as Earth Day, Main Street Highland Park's Street Fair and 5K Run in the Park, and of course, walking along our downtown to shop or eat this spring!


