In continued efforts to encourage residents' involvement, members of our Economic Development Committee hosted several meetings with residents of Walter Avenue to help define a Redevelopment Plan for a large property in the neighborhood. The meetings allowed the Borough to explain the unique attributes of the property and the possibilities for Redevelopment, while eliciting input on design, density, and use.

Our new Abandoned Property Ordinance is successfully improving the look, feel, and value of our residential neighborhoods. Earlier this year we identified nearly 25 properties which had shown neglect. More than half, have been either brought up to code, renovated or sold for renovation. This is an ongoing list and with concerted effort, we look forward to keeping our neighborhoods safe and maintaining the highest of property values. Should you suspect a residential property is vacant or in neglect, please contact Code Enforcement at 732-819-3795.

When you have a moment, please take a walk over to the corner of Raritan and South Adelaide Avenues where we have laid a beautiful monument to the late Councilman Jon Erickson. With a generous contribution from his wife, Anne Sherber, and family, the Borough has dedicated a new bus stop and seating area to our friend and colleague for his years of commitment to Highland Park and our residents. Special thanks to Jim Nichols, AIA, LEED AP, Chair of Main Street Design Committee who designed the monument for us.

Programs at the Highland Park Senior Center

While the Highland Park Senior Center (located at 220 South 6th Ave) conducts programs to serve all citizens of the borough, a wide array of their offerings will appeal to observant Jews. The center holds a Yiddish speakers group weekly on Wednesday mornings, computer classes on Friday mornings, and chair yoga and senior walking groups on Monday mornings. The center screens popular recently released movies on Mondays in the early afternoons; in May, participants viewed The Post, The Greatest Showman, and The Shape of Water.

The Senior Center also holds weekly lunches (for a small fee) featuring varied programs, with kosher options provided by the Orchid and Giddy's restaurants on Tuesday and Thursday (courtesy of the Jewish Family Services' CAMEO On The Road program). Lunches in May included a visit by a therapy dog, musical entertainers, and a talk by a Vietnam veteran about the Navajo Code Talkers.

Additionally, the Senior Center provides free transportation to Borough residents to stops within town and to medical appointments out-of-town; rides are available at designated hours and advance registration is required.

Highland Park residents can attend all programs, and access the center's services, for a \$15/year membership fee. For more information, on the Senior Center's programs and services and to request a monthly calendar please contact us at 732-819-0052.
