Grand opening of Borough's new Teen Center – Zone 6, September 12th



The Borough of Highland Park invites residents, and especially teens, to celebrate the opening of the Zone 6 Teen Center, on Wednesday September 12th starting at 3:00 pm. Zone 6 is located at 600 Benner Street, on the corner of South 6th Ave.

The grand opening will feature brief remarks by Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler, Councilwoman Elsie Foster-Dublin, Zone 6 Director Ashton Burrell, and a Borough teenager TBA. Light refreshments will be served.

The mission of Zone 6 is to promote healthy age-appropriate development for teenagers in Highland Park, by providing an environment that fosters positive social skills, social competence, moral development, and self-esteem. Zone 6 will offer a safe and inviting supervised after-school haven, with cutting-edge technology for gaming, podcasting, movie viewing, computer use, and so much more.

"This will be the first building with activities exclusively dedicated to our teens in over two decades," said Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler. "Today, more than ever, our teens need a safe and welcoming environment after school hours. I want to thank the parents who have consistently expressed the need for this type of place and program in Highland Park. I also want to thank Councilwoman Elsie Foster-Dublin for her untiring dedication to making this place happen".
