Property Tax Deadlines



As you know, fourth quarter 2018 taxes were due on November 1. Because this is the last payment of the year, it is especially important to get this payment in on time. The grace period, during which residents can remit payment without interest, lasts until Tuesday, November 13.

Please pay all municipal payment balances before November 13, 2018 to avoid additional cost due to late payment (December water and sewer bills are not included in these charges).

*Please note: Municipal charges (taxes, water/sewer, sidewalk assessment and property maintenance violations) paid after November 13, 2018 are required by law to be charged an additional tax sale fee to release a lien against the property due to non-payment. If a property goes to tax sale, the property owner must pay the amount sold, together with all interest and accrued fees, to redeem the lien and avoid the tax sale process. Avoid these extra charges by making your payment on time!

DECA's Event Was A Dashing Success

On October 21st, 120 people participated in the Amazing DECA Dash, a town-wide scavenger hunt in Highland Park organized by HP HS students that promotes local businesses and community service. The event started at the high school, with thirty groups of four people each given clues that led them to various locations throughout the town. The event was walking only, and required the groups to complete fun challenges like stuffing a scarecrow, completing puzzles, and writing postcards for the veterans.

The first place winners were Juhee Jeong '19, Larkin Xu '19, Elizabeth Telysheva '19, and Zane Wilkerson '19. Their prize was an assortment of gift cards to local Highland Park business, like Okie-Pokie, 418 Burgers, Apostos and others with a total value of \$100!



A large portion of the proceeds were donated to two different charitable organizations: Wounded Warriors, which provides support to injured veterans, and K9 for Warriors, which supplies service animals to veterans with PTSD. In total, the event raised close to \$1,500, and over 100 handwritten postcards for veterans were made in one of the challenges.

Sponsorships from local Highland Park businesses like Blue Horse, All American Towing, and Pinos helped make this event possible. Also, all the places that allowed DECA to use their space were essential in making the race a success.

This event was organized by student coordinators Maria Rahi '19, Stella Draper '20, and myself (Olivia Parker '21). The event also would not have succeeded without the help from DECA advisors Mrs. Harper, Ms. Chirco, and Mr. Harper, as well as volunteers.

The Amazing DECA Dash received raving reviews from the racers. Matthew Parker, a participant who placed third in the race, said, "I had a lot of fun. The challenges were very creative, and my favorite was at OQ Coffee. We each had a spoon and bent down to scoop up coffee beans. We transported them to another table to fill up that bowl. When we dropped some, we had to restart! I loved that the event was to support a good cause, the Wounded Warriors. Given the success of this Amazing Deca Dash, the DECA club is looking into conducting it again next year.
