ICAT and ABLE Training





 ICAT is a training program that provides first responding police officers with the tools, skills, and options they need to successfully and safely defuse a range of critical incidents while keeping everyone involved safe



 ABLE teaches officers effective ways to step in when they believe an officer's actions are becoming inappropriate and it assists agencies in creating a culture that supports such intervention

All officers have been fully trained in both of these subjects

The NJ Safe Passing Law Went Into Effect on March 1st, 2022



NEW JERSEY SAFE PASSING LAW

SLOW DOWN, MOVE OVER



Your family, friends and neighbors are on the roads.

PASS 'EM LIKE YOU KNOW THEM

NJ HAS MADE IT A LAW for drivers to take extra precautions to protect people on the road walking, running, riding a bicycle or scooter, pushing a stroller, in a wheelchair and others.

HOW?

Practice now:

EXPECT many different road users.

SLOW on sight to determine safety.

MOVE OVER a lane if you can.

PASS ONLY WITH AT LEAST FOUR FEET FOR SAFETY

The Safe Passing Law requires:


All drivers must use "due caution" whenever they see vulnerable people on the road.

Specifically:

- Drivers must follow all current no-passing and no speeding laws AND move over a lane if there is one to move into
- On a single-lane road, drivers must allow at least a 4-foot safety zone when they pass
- If 4 feet is not possible on a section of road, drivers must slow to 25mph and be prepared to stop until they can pass safely without endangering those sharing the road

2022 1st Quarter Update:

The Borough was awarded a Distracted Driving Grant



From 2012-2016 over 800,000 crashes can be attributed to distracted driving. This grant aims to reduce those numbers by providing:

- 100 Hours of education and enforcement activity funded by the NJ Division of Highway Traffic Safety
- Provides officers to focus on distracted driving behaviors with an emphasis on cell phone use
- This initiative will be commencing this spring in conjunction with a statewide campaign designed to educate drivers and enforce these dangerous violations
