BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK ORDINANCE NO. 22-2051

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, MIDDLESEX COUNTY PROHIBITING SMOKING AT THE TOWN TABLES AND AMENDING THE "CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park, County of Middlesex as follows:

1. **Section 165-6** of the "Code of the Borough of Highland Park" is amended to prohibit smoking at the Town Tables and is amended to read as follows: [] Bracketed material deleted; underlined material is new.

§ 165-6. Smoking on outdoor grounds of Borough property prohibited.

- A. No person shall smoke while on the outdoor grounds of any and all Borough Municipal buildings including adjacent parking lots and in any and all of the Borough parks, recreational areas and adjacent parking lots whether owned, leased or utilized by the Borough[.] or in any designated street closure right-of-way designated for "Town Tables."
- 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as provided for by law.

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SELF-EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the *Borough of Highland Park* has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2022 budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the *Borough of Highland Park* that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
 - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
 - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASING OF WATER METERS AND ADVANCE METERING INFRASTRUCTURE AND REPLACEMENT AND TESTING OF THE EXISTING METERS

RESOLUTION: Council as a Whole

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law ("LPCL"), on three occasions bids were solicited by the Borough of Highland Park for the "Purchasing of Water Meters and Advance Metering Infrastructure and Replacement and Testing of the Existing Meters" project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, following the last two solicitations, bids were to be received on January 20, 2022 and March 29, 2022, respectively, and the Council rejected all bids on both occasions on the basis that they were nonconforming; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the LPCL, a nonconforming bid is not considered a "bid" at all; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the LPCL and in particular, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-5(3), a contract may be negotiated and awarded by at least two-thirds affirmative vote of the authorized membership of Council without public bidding when no bids were received in response to the advertisements; and

WHEREAS, Core & Main, LLC has offered to contract with the Borough to complete the Project in accordance with the Bidding and Contract Documents for which bids were solicited for the sum of \$1,265,751.25; and

WHEREAS, Core & Main, LLC's plumbing subcontractor is registered as of April 5, 2022 under the Public Works Contractor Registration Act, and said contractor is in compliance with the requirements as set forth in the March 29, 2022 solicitation; and

WHEREAS, as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(3)(i), the Borough has made a reasonable effort to confirm that the same or equivalent goods and services are not available from an agency or authority of the United States, the State of New Jersey, Middlesex County, or a municipality in close proximity to the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the terms, conditions and specifications for completion of the Project as set forth in the negotiated contract are the same as those solicited for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is obtaining these goods and services without a "fair and open process" as defined by P.L. 2004, c.19, the "Local Unit Pay-to-Play Law" and in connection therewith, Core & Main, LLC has completed and filed with the Borough the required Campaign Contributions Affidavit pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.8 and Certification Regarding Political

Contributions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 (collectively, the "Pay-to-Play Forms"); and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that the availability of sufficient funds for this contract in U-06-55-603-001.

WHEREAS there were 585 motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey in 2020; and

WHEREAS, approximately 40% of the motor vehicle occupants killed in traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt; and

WHEREAS, use of a seat belt remains the most effective way to avoid death or serious injury in a motor vehicle crash; and

WHEREAS, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimates that 135,000 lives were saved by safety belt usage nationally between 1975-2000; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization from May 23 - June 5, 2022 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of high visibility enforcement and public education; and WHEREAS, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate in the state from the current level of 90.23% to 93%; and

WHEREAS, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Highland Park, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey declares it's support for the Click It or Ticket seat belt mobilization, both locally and nationally, from May 23, 2021 - June 5, 2022 and pledges to increase awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of seat belt use.
