GREETINGS from the Mayor



I was delighted to meet with Middlesex County Commissioner Director Ronald G. Rios, along with Councilman Matthew Hersh (who oversees parks and recreation), and officials from Middlesex County and Borough staff, on June 22nd as we visited the two reconstructed playgrounds located in Donaldson Park. The on-site meeting culminated the efforts my efforts with County officials, to improve and repair damage done to the park by Hurricane Ida.

Improvements include Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant playground equipment, transfer systems to help everyone access the play apparatus, a pouredin-place (soft-playground) surface to replace the wood carpet, bench pads, and fencing between the playground and parking. In total, Middlesex County contributed more than \$754,000 to the equipment and installation.

Highland Park is blessed to be surrounded by two beautiful County parks. Donaldson Park's playground has been a community favorite that was destroyed in a recent storm. This beautiful new playground is flood resilient and has already been enjoyed by so many of our children and their families.

I hope you continue to enjoy our community, our beautiful parks, and our active downtown this summer. Please stay safe.

Each household may request up to two collections per year. There will be an additional town-wide bulk pick-up on September 13, 2022.



The Highland Park Police Department and the Safe Walking & Cycling Committee have teamed up to bring Street Smart NJ to Highland Park! Street Smart NJ is a public awareness and behavioral change pedestrian safety campaign. Since its creation in 2013, more than 200 communities have participated in Street Smart NJ.

Street Smart NJ emphasizes educating drivers and pedestrians through mass media andgrassroots outreach, as well as high visibility enforcement. Street Smart NJ complements, but doesn't replace, other state and local efforts to build safer streets and sidewalks, enforce laws and train better roadway users.

The campaign is coordinated by the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority and is supported by federal and state funds, with additional funding/in-kind contributions from local partners, including Keep Middlesex Moving, our area's transportation management association.

HIGHLAND BUCKS: HIGHLAND PARK'S LOCAL GIFT CARD PROGRAM

Buy a digital HP Bucks Gift Card and support our downtown small businesses! The HP Bucks electronic gift card can be purchased online and used at many downtown stores, restaurants, and services. https:// app.yiftee.com/gift-card/hp-buckshighland-park/

How does it work? All you do is select the value of your Highland Bucks that you want to purchase. Then select your recipient (yourself, family, friends, etc.) and send via email or text message. The recipient can use that value to make purchases at participating Highland Bucks gift card merchants [418 Burgers, Bridge Turkish Grill, HP Farmers' Market, iBrows Beauty Studio, Linx8, Mordy's

Bakery, Pappagalo's, PatronCutz, Pino's, and Robert's Florals]. The card can be used at any location that has signed up for the program. The digital card works like a credit card and is keyed in manually into a business' POS or terminal systems as a credit card. There are no physical cards available, although the card can be printed out onto a piece of paper if you choose.

These gift cards are intended to be used in store or over the phone with the listed participating merchants. Additional businesses are being added every day! Neighborhood Preservation Program

Late last year, Highland Park was awarded a \$750k Neighborhood Preservation Program (NPP) grant to be used over the next five years to revitalize Woodbridge Avenue and the adjacent neighborhood. In March 2022 the Woodbridge Avenue NPP 5-year Implementation Plan was formally adopted by Mayor & Council and approved by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (NJDCA). Some projects the funding is slated to be used for include grants for businesses and homeowners, improvements to Molimock-Graff Park, addition of new trees, purchase of additional trash receptacles and street furniture, commission of public art, and installation of holiday decorations.

Work related to NPP is being coordinated by Emma Von Thun, NPP Coordinator, with input from a volunteer Stakeholder Engagement Team.
