NATURE AND REASON FOR CHANGE SUPPLEMENTAL WORK IN THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK.

It does not appear to materially expand upon the size, nature, or scope of the project as it was originally described in the bid specification nor could the extra work reasonably be effectuated by a separate bid contract without imposing adverse cost consequences.
