## GREETINGS

from the Mayor



The Borough of Highland Park was pleased to host a ribbon cutting on Thursday September 29th to celebrate the formal opening of the nearly \$2 million dollar renovation of the track, turf field, and lighting at the Recreation Complex behind the Highland Park Middle School/High School. The renovation was funded by an allocation from the NJ State FY 2022 budget, which was matched by funding from the

Borough of Highland Park Municipal Budget and the Board of Education of Highland Park.

As I said at this event, "The Recreation Complex at the Middle School/High School is the only large parcel of land owned by the Borough. As such, it has served as the location for different broadly-attended Borough activities over the years. For example, 2020's large protest rally after the killing of George Floyd took place at and near that site. Additionally, during the height of Covid-19 the field and track provided much needed and well-used outdoor, safe activity space for walkers, joggers and others. It became evident that the Recreation Complex was a space ALL Highland Parkers could use and many did.

The demand for the track & turf field is so high at the Middle School and High School that it is not uncommon to have three or four activities going on simultaneously. Prior to the repairs, the track barely passed inspection in 2019 and there was a strong likelihood that it would no longer pass inspection, so it could not be used in competitions."



We are not the only ones to recognize the fine quality of our new recreation complex. In November, the New Jersey Society of Municipal Engineers will present a first place award in their Municipal Construction Management Projects 'E' Category to the Borough's engineering firm, CME Associates, for their work on this project. Congratulations CME Associates!

Passage of Ordinance to Establish Pedestrian Mall on So. 3rd Avenue: After hearing thoughtful comments from residents both for and opposed, on October 19th the Borough Council voted unanimously in favor to adopt the ordinance to establish a Pedestrian Mall, or public plaza, on So. 3rd Avenue at Raritan Avenue. The passage of the ordinance is one of the steps required by the NJ Department of Transportation (NJDOT) along with an approved Street Intersection Permit. The Borough prepared a Frequently Asked Questions document to address some of the common questions about the creation of the public space and the related permanent closure of So. 3rd Avenue; this document is available on the Borough's website.

Return to In-Person Meetings, Nov. 1: Borough Council meetings returned to Council Chambers in Borough Hall starting on Nov. 1st. Meetings are livestreamed on our HPTV15 YouTube Channel as well as on the Optimum (channel 15) and FiOS (channel 44) cable TV channels. Recordings of Council meetings are archived and can be viewed anytime on the HPTV 15 YouTube channel.

Property Revaluation Update: The Borough's revaluation contractor, Professional Property Appraisers, is in town doing field inspections; however, they are a bit delayed due to staffing availability. Residents are encouraged to continue to cooperate and make their properties available so that we can complete the inspections in time for the 2023 tax year.

#### **NEW RESOURCE AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER**

Highland Park community members with visual impairments now have a brand new resource that can greatly aid them in browsing the Internet, job searching online, attending Zoom meetings, typing documents, and completing other activities on a computer.



Thanks to local resident Angela Perrone, the Highland Park Community Center's library now has a desktop computer with JAWS (Job Access with Speech) and MAGIC software installed. The two programs work together to create large icons of available programs and software on the computer monitor and the capability for the computer to read out the different icons as they are selected by the user.

Perrone shared the software with the HP Community Center and the Center staff worked with the Borough's IT consultant to have it installed in early August. Both programs are available for use by any member of the HP Community Center, during regular business hours. Perrone also donated a large type keyboard for use with the computer equipped with the two programs.

"Angela's gift was a real blessing to the Community Center," said Kimberly McGraw, Director of the Borough's Office of Aging Services. "So much of what we do is provide resources, services, and activities to empower residents to take charge of their needs. These new computer can give residents programs with visual limitations broad new capabilities. We are very grateful for Angela's generous donations to the Community Center."
