Soterios Johnson - (1968) For nearly two decades, listeners of WYNC would wake up to Soterios Johnson's voice every day at 6am. Johnson was a radio journalist and local host of NPR's Morning Edison on WNYC until August 2016. He got his start in radio at Highland Park High School, where he participated in the high school's radio station after school. He worked at WKCR, and in 2003 he became the host of WYNC's Morning Edition, editing and delivering the news, and eventually producing features and interviewing newsmakers. Johnson attended Columbia University, majoring in American History. In August 2016 he left WNYC to join the University of California/Davis as Director of Humanities, Arts, and Cultural Programs. Library Patrons Given Access to NJ Written Driving Exams

The Highland Park Public Library, in partnership with Driving-Tests.org, a company dedicated to driver safety and education, is making available free NJ Department of Motor Vehicles practice tests at the website http://hpplnj.driving-tests.org. This is the only site of its kind to let users hear selections read aloud, make selections into MP3s, translate pages into other languages, magnify text, and mask portions of the screen for greater visibility on practice tests. The new program will work as an outreach to teens, those with disabilities, and seniors who need to take renewal exams, as well as anyone who wants to take written practice exams.
