



The library is continuing its renovation journey this summer with two additional projects. Our meeting room and public restrooms are getting complete makeovers, and a new outdoor porch will be added near our N. 6th Avenue entrance. These improvements are being funded by a generous donation from the Kushner Legacy Project. In addition, the replacement of the library's flat roof is expected to begin afterwards. Finally, the remaining interior renovations, which were financed by the New Jersey State Library and the Borough of Highland Park, are getting their finishing touches. We thank the residents of Highland Park for their patience and support as the library undergoes this transformation.

LMxAC, our library consortium, is changing their name to STELLA this summer. Along with the name change, STELLA is also providing the library with a new and improved computer system named VEGA. In June, you will start to see changes to the look and usability of our library app and library catalog.

In February the Highland Park Fire Department received a most generous donation from the Kushner Legacy Project, to fund the acquisition of a new 2024 Emergency One 2000 GPM Typhoon Pumper fire engine. On March 9th members of the Fire Dept's career staff received training on this apparatus led by a representative from Absolute Fire Protection. And on May 7th members of the career staff put this engine in service. "We absolutely love it & we know the residents of the borough will love it too," stated career firefighter Norm Shamy. The Fire Department last received a new pumper in 2004.
