#### What's With All the Water Main Breaks?

Water companies throughout New Jersey are seeing an increase in water main breaks, something Highland Park has fallen victim to numerous times. The reason for these continuous issues is a combination of old cast iron pipes, including pipes that may be more than 100 years old, combined with freezing weather conditions. When the cold weather hits, water mains expand and contract, causing these breaks.

This winter NJ American Water crews have repaired nearly 550 mains throughout the state – a 5% increase over the same period last year, and Middlesex Water has experienced a high volume of calls about frozen pipes and meters.

Water companies are addressing the problems with old pipes, but the aging underground infrastructure remains a problem. Throughout the country, 30% of water pipes and systems are between 40 and 80 years old, according to the EPA, and about 10% of those are older.

Highland Park works continuously to improve our infrastructure, working closely with water companies to make necessary upgrades and repair or replace problem areas.
