GREETINGS FROM THE MAYOR




As we look towards the Fall, I'm encouraged by all the signs of renewal in our business district.






There are many promising developments in our downtown. I hope you will join me in celebrating them all.

Capital Ordinance for Roadway Improvements – An ordinance authorizing funding for capital improvements to Highland Avenue, Graham Street (from So. 4th to So. 5th Avenue), and So. 8th Avenue (from Benner Street to Woodbridge Avenue) was introduced at the Mayor and Council meeting on August 13th and a public hearing was scheduled for Tuesday, September 3rd at 7 PM. Road work on Highland Avenue will be re-evaluated in light of the recent work performed by PSE&G related to its ongoing gas main replacement program. The Borough received a grant for \$550,000 from the NJDOT Local Transportation Projects Fund for these improvements.

Request for Proposals for Design Professionals for So. 3rd Avenue

Plaza – The Borough Council passed a resolution on August 13th authorizing the Borough Administrator to issue a request for proposals for planning, landscape architecture, and engineering services, for the creation of a pedestrian plaza on South 3rd Avenue. The Borough has been awarded a Fiscal Year 2025 Grant Appropriation from the State of New Jersey for \$1,000,000 in order to design and build a public plaza.



News about Redevelopment in Highland Park

At their meeting on July 16th, The Borough Council approved a resolution authorizing the Planning Board to undertake an investigation to determine if specific properties on the corner of So. 2nd and Raritan Avenues, commonly referred to as Sunoco, B-B-B shopping center, and Tract B, meet the criteria for an area in need of redevelopment with condemnation, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law. The Borough Council passed another resolution authorizing the Planning Board to undertake an area in need of redevelopment with condemnation study for 125 Raritan Avenue, also known as Classic Cleaners, which is located in the Tract A within the 2019 Downtown Redevelopment Plan for Tracts A-D. The Borough Planner, LRK, Inc., was authorized to conduct the studies.
