Both long-time providers of television and internet service, Cablevision, through its Optimum TV and Optimum Online products, is available townwide and Verizon, which first entered the Borough more than five years ago, has been expanding its FiOS TV and FiOS Internet infrastructure to reach all Borough neighborhoods. That project is set for completion in the next few months.
