I'm happy to report about some important improvements and great programs that are happening in our town.

Last month we broke ground on our first Habitat for Humanity house, located on South  $10^{th}$  Avenue. Volunteers came out to lay the foundation for the house, which is being built for a family that was affected by Hurricane Sandy. We look forward to welcoming this family to our community. In keeping with our commitment to our diversity and understanding of different cultures in Highland Park, once again our summer camp had the honor to host students from abroad. This summer more than 40 students from China joined children from Highland Park at our summer camp. This immersion program has been a huge success in the past few years. I thoroughly enjoyed meeting these children when they visited Borough Hall in July and August. This immersion program enables students from Highland Park and China to socialize and learn about each other's culture and customs. New friendships are made through a sharing of cultures and language.

Many of you have probably seen the repair work being done on Valentine Street. Through a grant from the Transportation Trust Fund, crews are working hard to make much-needed improvements to this street, including installing handicapped ramps on the sidewalk corners and milling and repaving the road. Construction should be completed by the end of October.

Tonight we'll be celebrating The Highland Park Police Department's National Night Out. I hope you all will be joining us there. Last year's event was a huge success, and I'm sure this year will be even better! Dozens of residents come out to visit and meet our officers and enjoy games, refreshments, activities and more. For the first time this year, we will be hosting a Special Hour for Special Needs residents. I want to send out a BIG THANK YOU to our Police Department, and to all of the volunteers who will be helping to run booths and activities.

I was proud to join the AJC and our Human Relations Commission chair, Ashton Burrell, in the signing of the AJC's Mayor's Against Anti-Semitism letter to leaders of Europe.
