WHEREAS, in 2018, an estimated 55,440 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States, and 44,330 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the third leading cause of cancer death in the United States, and it is projected to become the second leading cause around 2020; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a fiveyear relative survival rate in the single digits at just nine percent; and

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and 71 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis, while 91 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1,300 deaths will occur in New Jersey in 2018; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related death across the world; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that in 2020, there will be 484,000 new cases of pancreatic cancer diagnosed; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Highland Park are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about the symptoms and risk factors of pancreatic cancer, and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

"World Pancreatic Cancer Day"

WHEREAS, STAC has prepared a letter for Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler to be sent to all Borough residents concerning the public health and safety concerns related to the Emerald Ash Borer attach on ash trees; and

WHEREAS, STAC has recommended that in order to incentivize Borough residents to remove any ash trees on their property, the Borough Council waive any fees for a resident receiving a permit to remove an ash tree and also the requirement for tree replacement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park, Middlesex County as follows:
