CAPITAL ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RESTATING CAPITAL ORDINANCE NUMBER 15-1896 HERETOFORE FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (THE "BOROUGH") ON DECEMBER 1, 2015 PROVIDING FOR ACQUSITION OF A GENERATOR FOR THE SENIOR/YOUTH RECREATION CENTER, IN AND BY THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING \$132,800.00 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Highland Park, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") heretofore finally adopted Capital Ordinance Number 15-1896 on December 1, 2015, entitled "Capital Ordinance Providing for the Acquisition of a Generator for the Senior/Youth Recreation Center, in and by the Borough of Highland Park, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"); Appropriating \$132,800.00 Therefor to Pay the Cost Thereof" (the "Original Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough needs to increase the ordinance to fund additional expenditures as it relates to the acquisition and installation of said generator described in the Original Ordinance Number 15-1896; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough desires to amend and restate the Original Ordinance in its entirety in order to increase the appropriation therein by \$11,000.00, from \$132,800.00 to \$143,800.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (a majority of the full membership thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Capital Ordinance Number 15-1896 heretofore finally adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough on December 1, 2015, entitled "Capital Ordinance Providing for the Acquisition of a Generator for the Senior/Youth Recreation Center, in and by the Borough of Highland Park, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"); Appropriating \$132,800.00 Therefor to Pay the Cost Thereof" (the "Original Ordinance") is hereby amended and restated in its entirety, as follows:

"SECTION 1. The title of the Original Ordinance is hereby amended to read as

follows:

'CAPITAL ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION/INSTALLATION OF A GENERATOR FOR THE SENIOR/YOUTH RECREATION CENTER, IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (THE "BOROUGH"); APPROPRIATING \$143,800.00 THEREFOR TO PAY THE COST THEREOF'.

SECTION 2. The capital purpose described in Section 3 of this capital ordinance is hereby authorized as a general capital purpose to be undertaken by the Borough of Highland Park, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3 hereof, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$143,800.00, said sum consisting of a New Jersey Hazardous Mitigation Grant in the amount of \$132,800.00.

SECTION 3. The capital purpose hereby authorized is the acquisition and installation of a generator for the Senior/Youth Recreation Center located at 220 South Sixth Avenue within the Borough.

SECTION 4. The expenditure of the \$143,800.00 appropriation, consisting of a Grant in the amount of \$132,800.00 and \$11,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Fund, for the purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof is hereby authorized and approved.

SECTION 5. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance and to the extent of any inconsistency herewith, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs is on file in the office of the Clerk and is available for public inspection.

**SECTION 6.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately after final adoption as described in N.J.S.A. 40:49-2."

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK,
CHAPTER 230, "LAND DEVELOPMENT"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION I.** Chapter 230-5 of the Code of the Borough of Highland Park is amended to read as follows (additions to text are <u>underlined</u>; deletions are [bracketed]):

B. Upon receipt of an application for development, the Control Officer shall forward the submitted material to the municipal agency, or its authorized committee or designee, for review and to certify the application is complete. All completed applications shall be reviewed by the following agencies (Fire Official, Police Department, Environmental Commission and <a href="Safe Walking and Cycling Committee">Safe Walking and Cycling Committee</a>). Request for reviews from the Borough Engineer and/or Planner shall be optional and are to be determined by the reviewing Board.

**SECTION II.** Chapter 230-31 of the Code of the Borough of Highland Park is amended to read as follows (additions to text are <u>underlined</u>; deletions are [bracketed]):

Whenever the Environmental Commission has prepared and submitted to the Planning Board an index of the natural resources of the municipality, the Planning Board shall make available to the Environmental Commission and Safe Walking and Cycling Committee an informational copy of every application for development to the Planning Board for review and comment. Failure of the Planning Board to make such an information copy available to the Environmental Commission and the Safe Walking and Cycling Committee shall not invalidate any hearing or proceeding.

2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, WITH RESPECT TO THE ISSUANCE AND SALE BY THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND ASSISTANCE RENTAL ITS HOUSING AUTHORITY PARK DEMONSTRATION PROJECT, SERIES 2017 OBLIGATIONS AND **MATTERS** APPROVING CERTAIN AND **AUTHORIZING CONNECTION THEREWITH** 

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the Borough of Highland Park (the "Authority" or the "Housing Authority") is a public body corporate and politic, constituting an agency and instrumentality of the State of New Jersey (the "State"), created by the Borough of Highland Park (the "Borough") in the County of Middlesex, within the State pursuant to the provisions of the Housing Authorities Law, Chapter 67 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1950, codified at N.J.S.A. 55:14A-1 et seq., repealed and replaced by the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, under Chapter 79 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1992, as amended and supplemented, and codified at N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority owns and operates residential rental public housing projects, for which it has received approval from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to convert the 24 units of its three (3) public housing projects to Authority-owned and operated multifamily housing under (collectively, the "Project") to the Rental Assistance Demonstration Program, P.L. 112-55 (2012) ("RAD"), administered by HUD; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the Authority to issue bonds, notes, certificates, debentures or other obligations secured by the revenues of the Authority (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-16(5) and -29); and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the purposes of the Act, the Authority proposes to enter into a loan (the "Loan") with Community Loan Fund of New Jersey, Inc. (the "Lender") in an amount not to exceed \$473,500 and to issue and deliver its Promissory Note to the Lender in like amount to evidence the Loan (the "Obligation") upon substantially the terms and conditions contained in the commitment letter attached hereto as Exhibit A as such terms may be further negotiated and revised by the Authority, and to apply the proceeds of the Loan to finance capital improvements and make an initial deposit to the renewal and replacement escrow for the Project that will be subject to the RAD program and to pay costs in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Obligation, when issued, will be a special and limited Obligation of the Authority, and neither the Borough, nor any political subdivision thereof (other than the Authority, but solely to the extent of the trust estate as defined in the Resolution (as defined below)), will be obligated to pay the principal or redemption price of, redemption price or interest on, the Loan, and neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Borough or any political subdivision

thereof will be pledged to the payment of the principal or redemption price of, or interest on, the Obligation; and

WHEREAS, the Obligation will be issued pursuant to the terms of the Act, other applicable law and agreements and a resolution to be adopted by the Authority prior to the issuance of the Obligation authorizing the issuance of the Obligation (together with any amendments or supplements, (the "Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A 40A:12A-29(d) requires that the governing body in which a housing authority financing housing projects determine that the rate of interest on any such financing undertaken by a housing authority be in the best interest of the municipality.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK as follows:

Section 1. The Borough acknowledges that the Housing Authority proposes to execute and deliver its Obligation in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$473,500 and together with additional funds of the Authority, to (i) finance capital improvements to the Project that is subject to the RAD program, (ii) fund an initial deposit to the replacement reserve escrow, and (iii) pay costs in connection therewith. The terms and conditions for the issuance of the Obligation shall be as provided in the Commitment dated March 2, 2017 with New Jersey Community Capital (the "Bank") as amended and extended (the "Commitment"). The Obligation shall be dated, shall bear interest at such rate of interest, and shall be payable as to principal, interest and redemption premium, if any, all as specified in the Commitment from the Bank to the Authority. The interest rate for the Obligation will be set one day prior to the closing on the RAD conversion and shall be fixed at the then equivalent 15-year Federal Finance Rate, to match the Loan Term, plus 3.460%, fixed for the Term. As of February 15, 2017, the indicative interest rate during the Term would be 5.182%.

The term of the Bonds shall be 15 years based upon a three hundred (300) month amortization schedule.

Payments will be made in 300 equal monthly installments of principal and interest.

The Authority may prepay the Obligation as follows: the Authority shall be allowed to prepay up to ten percent (10%) of the original principal balance annually (\$47,350.00). In annual prepayment amounts greater than \$47,350.00, the Loan shall not be subject to prepayment during the first five (5) prepayment years of the Loan Term. Thereafter, the Borrower may prepay the Loan, in whole or in part, subject to a prepayment penalty equal to the greater of 1) one-percent (1.00%) or 2) the present value of the difference between the remaining interest payments scheduled to be paid on the Loan (or the portion of the Loan being repaid) to maturity and the remaining time to maturity as the Loan, or portion thereof, being prepaid made at 3.460% over the then current 15-year Federal Financing Bank or reasonable comparable index.

Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Borough nor any political

subdivision thereof will be pledged to the payment of the principal or redemption price of, or interest on, the Obligation. Nothing in the Obligation or the Resolution will assign or pledge therefor any other funds or assets of the Authority, the County or the Borough.

- Section 2. Subject to satisfaction of the conditions set forth below, the Borough hereby finds and determines, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A 12A-29(d), that the rate of interest, as described above, is in the best interest of the Borough. The Authority shall establish, to the satisfaction of Borough officials at or before the issuance of the Promissory Notes, that the Authority has either performed, or covenanted to perform, each of the following conditions:
- A. The proceeds of the Obligation, together with available moneys of the Authority, shall be applied to: (i) finance capital improvements to the Authority's Project that is subject to the RAD program; (ii) make an initial deposit to the replacement reserve escrow; and (iii) pay costs in connection therewith. The proceeds of the Obligation shall not be used for any other purpose other than as described above.
- B. The Authority shall provide a copy of the closing transcript with respect to the Obligation to the Borough.
- C. The Mayor, Borough and the Borough's Chief Financial Officer are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver such certificates, agreements and documents, and to take such other actions as may be necessary or appropriate in order to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby.
- D. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be filed with the Clerk of the Borough of Highland Park and the Housing Authority. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon the adoption hereof.
