AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK IN MIDDLESEX COUNTY,  
AMENDING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLAND PARK CONCERNING ARTICLE II  
OF SECTION 247 CONCERNING MASSAGE PARLORS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Highland Park Borough Council, Middlesex County as follows:

1. Article II of Chapter 247 of the "Code of the Borough of Highland Park, 2010" is amended by deleting therefrom any reference to "massage parlors" and replacing that reference to massage therapy establishments.

2. Section 247-17F(3) is amended by adding thereto the following new language:

"The individual applying for the permit must do so in person at the Office of the Borough Clerk and provide their personal motor vehicle license or a U.S. passport containing the photograph identification of the applicant as provided for in (5) herein below."

3. Section 247-17G of said Code is amended by adding thereto the following new language:

"The references shall not reside at the same address."

4. Section 247-15 of said Code is amended by adding thereto the following new language:

"D. The annual permit issued to a premise shall be deemed to run with and be applicable to any premise for the term of the permit."

5. Section 247-27 of said Code establishing penalties for violating this Article is amended by adding thereto the following new language:

"B. Any person, firm, corporation or other entity found to be operating any establishment or utilizing any premise in the Borough of Highland Park as or for a massage or body work therapy establishment after having been denied a permit or after failing to renew a permit/license after being notified of their failure to renew said permit/license at least twice may be closed by order of the Construction Official, Health Officer or Chief of Police in addition to the general penalties set forth herein above."

"Section 374-5. Tax Lien Redemption Fee. The Tax Collector shall charge a person or entity seeking a Tax Sale Certificate payoff or updated amount to redeem a Tax Sale Certificate as authorized by N.J.S.A. 54:5-54 and N.J.S.A. 54:5-97.1."

WHEREAS, the Borough Administrator and the Department of Public Works have reviewed the proposal submitted by UniFirst Corp., Whippany, New Jersey, a participant in the National Joint Purchasing Alliance, a Co-operative that Highland Park belongs to; and
