APPROVAL OF MINUTES

May 8, 2018

It was MOVED by WELKOVITS and seconded by FOSTER-DUBLIN that the minutes of May 8, 2018 be approved with a voice vote by all present with abstentions from Councilman George and Councilwoman Kim-Chohan the May 8, 2018 minutes were approved.

PRESENTATIONS

31 River Road Redevelopment Plan

Jim Constantine, Planner said this was a one-acre medical office site on River Road and Walter Avenue. He said that the building is about 20% occupied and the property is for sale. Three goals in the Master Plan have been identified; identify opportunities for revitalization and redevelopment infill in the Borough's non-residential district, this land is located in the Professional Office (PO) district so it meets that goal. To minimize conflict between residential and nonresidential uses, and when this was operating as a robust office complex, neighbors informed us of those a lot to with parking circulation and traffic. Encourage infill development that is compatible and this being a key issue for the neighborhood on Walter to have the compatibility with the scale, density and design of the Borough's existing residential neighborhood. He said that the prior proposal ran into some issues and feedback from the neighborhood that it was too large, scale was challenging. The Redevelopment plans, goals and principals were set. The first was an opportunity for neighborhood feedback, and there was an input meeting and a feedback meeting with the neighborhood. Another issue is taking advantage of a unique sustainable development opportunity and on this site; you can provide the most energy efficient form of housing within walking distance to transit. The first site-specific goal was to maintain the existing perimeter buffer landscaping as well as trees along the streetscape, there would be an attempt to save the existing trees, installation of sidewalks. Limit vehicular access to the existing driveway, there is one that is ingress only off River Road and a two-way drive off Walter Avenue, there will be parking in the rear of the site, full access on Walter, maybe ingress only on River Road. Ensure that anything that happens along Walter Avenue

frontage is keeping with the scale and character, smaller in scale limited in height and design character that reflects the neighborhood. Limit any larger multifamily building to the River Road frontage where it can act as a buffer from the heavy traveled corridor.
